
The belief that all members of each race possess characteristics, abilities, or qualities specific to that race, especially so as to distinguish it as inferior or superior to another race or races

Prevalence of racism (Challenging Racism Project)

- 20 per cent of Australians have been on the receiving end of racist hate talk
- 11 per cent have been excluded from the workplace/social settings because of their race
- 5 per cent of Australians have experienced physical assault because of their race



2013 Scanlon Foundation Surveys

- 19 per cent of Australians have experienced racial or religious discrimination during the past 12 months
- Previously 12 per cent in 2012
- Particularly high levels for non-English speaking background Australians



Children and young people

- 80 per cent of students from non-Anglo backgrounds reported experiencing racial discrimination
- Over two-thirds of these experiences of racism occurred at school



Harms of racism

- Civic, physical and mental health
- "I experience racism on an all too regular basis ... It is a tremendous psychological blow because it is something that I experienced from age 5 to now and I am often left feeling helpless and vulnerable for days afterwards."

"It makes me feel like I am lower than everyone else, an intruder who is not part of this society."



Cyber-bullying

- Just the same as plain bullying?
- Distinctive characteristics invasive, audience, anonymity
- One in 10 children experience it
- Rise in cyber-racism

Cyber-bullying and BackMeUp

- "BackMeUp has made me more confident as to what I can do as a bystander - it is hard to watch something so horrible happen to someone and feel useless, but it is an amazing feeling to actually be able to help someone out."
- "I'm ready to take action if I can see any signs of cyberbullying."

- A hostile social climate can open the door to devaluation and disparagement

Race Discrimination Act

- Outlaws racial discrimination and promotes equality before the law
- Outlaws racial vilification
 - Section 18C: acts that offend, insult, humiliate or intimidate on the basis of race
 - - Section 18D: free speech exemptions

Bystander scenarios

- Kitty Genovese, who was murdered in a New York City street in the presence of 38 witnesses
- One study: 44 per cent of incidents of race bullying at school bystanders did nothing, with one quarter in fact encouraging the bullying
- What can bystanders do?
