

This presentation will provide an insight into what teens are doing online in relation to pornography, what the research says about its effects and offer tips and guidance for those who work with young people to help them to make safe, healthy decisions around pornography consumption.

The Importance of Experiencing Failure in Childhood



Dr Rachael Sharman, Senior Lecturer in Psychology, University of the Sunshine Coast

Where is the line between supporting and enabling? When does help become hinderance? Failure is an important part of the learning process and a stepping stone to improvement

and resilience. Resilience in the face of challenge or failure leads to improved problem-solving skills, self-confidence and success. So why under stress, do some people wilt and wither away, while others roll up their sleeves and try again, try harder, or try something different? This presentation will review the evidence for the role that failure plays in learning and cognitive development as well as provide a framework for encouraging children to develop some effective coping strategies to deal with their emotions; figure out what they did wrong; and finally, adapt their approach and try again in a different way.
