

Put Your Own Mask on First — Why We Must Invest in Staff Wellbeing

When flying, passengers are always advised to apply their own oxygen mask before assisting other passengers. We know that we are no use

in the service of others if incapacitated ourselves. However, this is something that we often forget as educators, health professionals, parents, carers and supporters of young people. Our wellbeing is put last and when running on empty, how can we ensure we are giving our best when functioning close to our worst? This presentation will investigate work burnout, overwhelm and stress and offer simple and practical tools that both workers and management can implement to better take care of staff wellbeing.

Listening to Young People

As Australia's Youth Representative to the UN, Kareem completed a marathon listening tour in 2019, visiting 56 locations around Australia and

conducting 233 consultations at a diverse range of organisations, from schools and non-profits to juvenile detention centres. The issues raised were as varied as the young people themselves, but one key message remained constant; supporting us better starts with listening more. This presentation will highlight key learnings from the Listening Tour and provide insights and case studies from young people across Australia.

Teaching Values of Being Human — An Education of the Mind and the Heart

We live in an uncertain world; political unrest, social injustices, global warming and climate change, food and water insecurity, the impending global threat of loneliness and more. This can

make it hard for young people to stay optimistic. Yet, we want them to revel in the fact that they're uniquely human and are blessed to live on this fabulous blue planet. Yes, there are challenges ahead, but our challenge is to teach the exquisiteness of being human — our ingenuity, empathy, creativity, teamwork, resiliency and capacity to pull together. In this session, Mark's focus is on guided conversations and activities to coach 'Social and Emotional Literacy' and ignite 'emotional intelligence'.

The Impact of Pornography — What's the Science?

Pornography is everywhere. Technological advances have meant that everyone of us – and every one of our teens – is walking around with porn in our pockets. Because pornography has

become so mainstream, some argue that it's no big deal. Teens, in particular, shrug it off. After all, they know it's "not real". Yet teenagers are the biggest consumers of pornography in the world. Is it a big deal? Does it matter? They'll assure us that it doesn't affect them. Research tells us that it does matter. Pornography is affecting the beliefs and the behaviours of adolescents (and adults), and its effects are being felt at the heart of relationships. Not only does porn affect the heart, but addiction researchers are increasingly acknowledging that pornography is also affecting the mind in harmful ways. How do we protect children from harmful content? How do we help them to make safe, healthy decisions when it comes to explicit content online - whether it is in the form of pornography, or sexts that they produce themselves? Is it ever ok? This presentation is designed for educators, giving them an insight into what teens are doing online in relation to pornography, and more importantly, offering tips and guidance to those who work with adolescents to help them to make safe, healthy decisions around pornography consumption.
